

## **Results of the Parish Council Consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan**

94 responses were received however not all questions were answered.

The next stage is to form five working groups of local residents to gather the evidence and consult further with villagers on one of the five policy areas. Each working group will then make detailed recommendations for one of the five main policy areas. Ideally each working group will have 5 or 6 members with a special interest in their particular policy area, although everyone is welcome to take part. The working groups would probably need to meet every few weeks and will have the support of the Neighbourhood Plan project manager (Sue Parry), an experienced planning consultant (Corrie Newell) and when needed further advice from SCDC and members of LPC. This is a real opportunity to make a lasting and important contribution to the future of Linton and Hildersham at a key moment.
